Salvation Simply Stated

Salvation requirements are clearly understood and explained in the Holy Bible. Listed are the following steps that are all required. All of the steps together are required. Every Christian is called to follow these steps. Although very few respond in obedience to the call.

- 1. Accept Yeshua (Jesus) as the Messiah and the Son of God, having died for our sins. We are not saved by any other name, only by Yeshua.
- 2. Repent which is defined for us by Yeshua, it is becoming a new person in walking forward and no longer sinning. This means walking forward in this manner through the rest of your life up to the time that you die. Repent is not a onetime event it is an active way of living your entire life from that point forward.
- 3. Sin is defined for us in God's word, it is walking outside the Law or Torah. Breaking any one of the commands in the law is the same as breaking all. The Law is much more than just limited to the ten commandments.
- 4. We are to follow, hear and obey Yeshua. This is not a choice of pick and choose. When you follow a person, you walk as they showed us how to walk. Note, Yeshua kept the seventh day Sabbath and He kept the Holy Days.
- 5. **Yeshua told us the Law or Torah is not done away with.** It is in effect up to the Last Day, the second and final resurrection. By telling us this, it becomes a command that Yeshua gives us and one we must walk in.
- 6. Yeshua told us to grow in the heart. He emphasized this many times. This is but one of the commands that Yeshua gave us. Many people in error tell themselves that they are saved because their heart is right with Yeshua. Understand that this is only One of the commands that we need to keep in order to obtain salvation. The other 5 are required along with this one. If ones heart is truly right with God, it means you are walking in Total Obedience to God, since our love to God is by walking forward in all his commands, or walking forward in the Torah. In addition, what one views as their heart being right with God falls far short of that God requires.

If one walks as described in all the steps above, then one walks the same as the original congregations or Churches set up by Paul as well as the Jews that accepted and followed Yeshua. Then you walk in a manner that gives you Saint status, according to God's use of the word. Then you will not have to take the test or temptation and pass through the Tribulation and you will be resurrected at the end of the Tribulation.

None of the six mainstream groups of Christian Churches of today walk according to the above, none of them walk in the Torah. All of the six mainstream groups of Christian Churches will be

required to take the test of the Tribulation and go through it, if they are still alive just before it starts.

Those that die before the Tribulation starts will be Judged by Yeshua, before the Great White Throne at the end of the Millennium, at the second resurrection. How they are Judged will depend upon how close they walked to the above six requirements along with situations of life at the time of their walk. Those found to have walked close enough to the conditions above will be given eternal life and resurrected at the end of this world. They will be the large masses of people that Yeshua collects.

Each person is responsible for how he walks. If you can read and think, you are responsible. We cannot try and place blame on someone else – scripture is clear on this. When a pastor tells you something that is wrong and you accept it, you are personally responsible from not using your Bible and checking whether it is true or not. Everything is in scripture and we are to *follow only scripture*. God's ways are much higher than man's ways. Also God does not change, He is the same in the past, today and tomorrow. When He tells us something is forever, it stays that way until He tells us different. No one knows the criteria or threshold that Yeshua uses for this Judgment in giving salvation.

Understand, salvation scripture is clear. One is given the Holy Spirit if one walks in total obedience to God and it then acts to open scripture to us. Providing one accepts and obeys what is opened, the Spirit will continue to open scripture. The Pastors in the various Churches learned the Bible in a college with a classroom setting and now teach Church Doctrine that they learned. They did not learn from the Holy Spirit. From the errors they learned, they do not obey what Yeshua tells us. Therefore it is very likely that the Holy Spirit is dormant within them. The only Doctrine one is to follow is that of the *Complete Bible* itself, not what man says.

If the writings of Paul say anything that is contrary to what Yeshua said or showed us, you have the wrong understanding of Paul's words. We are not saved by Paul, we are saved by Yeshua. What Yeshua tells us is always our default, it is the truth and what is required for our walk in this life.

No, the Torah was never done away with, it was not completed for us by Yeshua so that we do not need to walk in it. No, it was not nailed to the cross. No, it is not only for the Jews. These are lies of error that pastors in the various Churches tell their congregations. There are many other lies as well. There is *One Law* and it applies to All, Jew or Gentile. The Law applies to all that are Yeshua's. We are all Judged equally by Yeshua. If you keep Christmas and Easter, you are walking outside of the Torah as you are keeping man's Holi-days and not God's Holy Days.

What is fast approaching, in a very few years from now, is a major change in God's Judgment. It is a test or temptation that God is bringing on the entire world. The reward of passing the test is enormous, the punishment of failing the test is loss of one's salvation. This means even if you were walking correctly enough for obtaining salvation prior to the test and then you fail the test, you lose your salvation.

Note, Yeshua and the Father are merciful and loving always ready to accept you with open arms, wiping away your previous sins. This is a conditional acceptance, it is based upon your repenting and then walking forward in total obedience to God's commands and no longer sinning. The commands are all contained in the Torah and following Yeshua. If you fail the test of the Tribulation, you will not be allowed to repent. Failing the test seals ones fate.

We are saved by grace, a gift from God, but that does not do away with walking in the Torah. Walking in the Torah shows our love to God and it is given to us in order for us to grow and mature as God's children. It defines the narrow path we are to walk on. The Torah is given to us in order to help us to grow in a manner that we come to value what God values. God is our Heavenly Father and He instructs us, His Children, on how we are to grow.

All the above is in the Holy Bible. Salvation requirements are easily found and clearly given if you have an open mind and not preconceived ideas. In addition you need to read in proper context and with logic, unfortunately few do this. Prophecy is well hidden.

Get rid of all preconceived ideas and with an open mind really learn what God's word tells us. Added to this is you must go forward with Prayer.

Understand one does not know how strict or how lenient Yeshua will be when He Judges us. Do you really want to leave things to chance by not walking forward in the manner that Yeshua has told us that we are to walk. Where you spend eternity depends on the free will choices one makes and how you walk in the life that God gave you.
